What is Hybrid Learning?

Hybrid Learning gives students the option to complete their entire degree through a combination of online and face-to-face courses, depending on the needs of the student at any given point during their college career. Students move fluidly between online or in-person learning, either at home or in multiple locations chosen to best fit the learning experience. Students decide the type of coursework in which they want to enroll!

Students that enroll in Unity College: Hybrid Learning can count on the same level of quality and support Unity College has always offered, but in a way that suits their lifestyle and academic goals.

What are the Benefits of Hybrid Learning?

Flexible: Shorter terms, a nonstandard calendar, differentiated tuition, no centralized location, and a multi-modality curriculum offer students more control over the cost, pace, and modality of their education.

Accessible: Hybrid Learning combines the benefits of Unity College's online and face-to-face learning models. Hands-on learning is available when needed without requiring students to be locked into one location or modality for the duration of their program.

Affordable: A Hybrid education is more affordable than our Flagship program: \$550 per credit hour for face-to-face courses, and \$470 per credit hour for online courses, potentially decreasing annual tuition by over 50%.
