

ABOUT SKY LODGE

Sky Lodge is a historic, cabin resort and campus situated on more than 150 acres in **Moose River Valley, Maine**. Originally built in 1929 as a hunting and fishing getaway, it was named "Sky Lodge" by two former WWII airmen in the 1940s and has been known by that name ever since. In 2018, Elaine and John Couri gifted it to **Unity Environmental University**.

Sky Lodge features a restaurant, conference center, contemporary cabins for rental, the Elaine and John Couri Welcome Center, the Moose River Valley Center, and year-round recreational trails. Outdoor activities nearby include hiking, golfing, biking, canoeing, kayaking, fishing, whitewater rafting, cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, and snowmobiling.

For the outdoor adventure enthusiast, **Unity Environmental University's Sky Lodge** provides a unique opportunity to travel with purpose. Sky Lodge embodies the mission of Unity Environmental University, allowing visitors to enjoy the natural environment surrounding them while also embracing sustainable practices and environmental stewardship. It also offers Unity students a place to immerse themselves in learning about sustainable tourism, hospitality, adventure careers, wildlife conservation, biology, and more.

Sky Lodge is an integral part of the local economy in the **Moose River Valley** and the greater Jackman, Maine area.

Together, we are laying the foundation for Unity students and the wider public to experience a real-world manifestation of environmental stewardship within a strong business model.



Dear Elaine and John,

As we celebrate seven years since your generous gift of Sky Lodge and the Moose River Valley Center (MRVC) to Unity Environmental University, I want to thank you again and share some exciting updates from this past fiscal year.

I am happy to report that in 2024-25, we stabilized our staffing with the hiring of our new General Manager, Joshua Cattan, as well as our Guest Services Coordinator, Marguerite Correia, and our housekeeper and general helper, Jesse Newell. The team's knowledge of the hospitality industry and dedication to Sky Lodge have made a profound impact, and guest feedback has been overwhelmingly positive. Our team is also seeking ways to collaborate with Unity Environmental University at Pineland (Unity's in-person learning program) to host students at Sky Lodge for interactive field research projects and courses.

Since its reopening in November 2024, Sky Lodge has held numerous events, including a reunion for the family that owned the Lodge in the 1980s, a baby shower, our first wedding in several years, and Forest Hills School District's National Honor Society induction and high school prom. We were also pleased to host the leadership team from the Conservation Fund in February and an informational session about their plans for the conservation of 44,000 acres known as the Hilton Family Forest, which they recently acquired.

The Elaine and John Couri Welcome Center continues to serve as a cornerstone of local connection. At least three days a week, local senior citizens craft quilts and other items that are then donated to local auctions and Project Linus, which provides handmade quilts to children in neonatal intensive care. The Center also provides a space for monthly no-charge yoga classes led by a local instructor. It is a pleasure to see how this space is contributing to the health and well-being of the people who live and work in the region. The ongoing impact of the Welcome Center, Sky Lodge, and the MRVC on the Moose River Valley region is both meaningful and farreaching. We are proud to carry on your legacy of service, and we remain committed to making thoughtful capital investments that will ensure Sky Lodge continues to thrive for years to come.

REOPENING LODGE

Sky Lodge paused operations in the fall of 2023 to complete over \$1M in infrastructure upgrades designed to preserve the Lodge's rustic charm and enhance the student and guest experience. 


CONSERVATION FUND COMMUNITY FORUM

In February 2025, Sky Lodge proudly hosted the leadership team from the Conservation Fund. During a highly attended informational session, the Fund shared plans for the conservation of 44,000 acres known as the Hilton Family Forest.

People from around the region joined the discussion on how the land will be protected to ensure it remains a viable habitat for wildlife, recreational access, and sustainable forestry.

The Elaine and John Couri Welcome Center continues to serve as a hub for local connection and creativity in Moose River. The space has become a vibrant gathering place for crafting, painting, and sewing sessions, many of which support charitable efforts. Over the past year we regularly welcomed a group of approximately eight local seniors three days a week.

Additionally, the Welcome Center has become a setting for monthly community yoga classes, offered free of charge by a local instructor who generously donates her time. These classes promote wellness and inclusivity.






Participants in these crafting sessions often create items for local auctions or contribute to Project Linus, a national nonprofit that provides handmade quilts to children in hospital neonatal intensive care units and other nursery units in need. Their work adds both beauty and comfort to the lives of others, and we are proud to host them in a space that fosters such generosity.



CONTINUEDINFRASTRUCTURE

UPGRADES

During 2024–25, we made major capital improvements to Sky Lodge's infrastructure and security. A new security camera system was installed in June and several structural, electrical, and interior upgrades were completed across the property.

















RENOVATIONS

- Repaired chimneys in Cedar Cabin, Trails End House, and Mountain View Cabin
- Installed a new fireplace insert in the Mountain View Cabin
- Repointed and waterproofed the Lodge foundation
- Deteriorating logs in the main Lodge and cabins were repaired and replaced by a log cabin expert
- Renovated the Country House, including new paint, flooring, and bathroom doors
- Upgraded electrical systems with new panels in the Maintenance Garage, Fitness Building, and Museum
- Completed minor renovations in the Dehle House
- Deep-cleaned the Lodge kitchen in preparation for reopening dining
- Renovated the bathrooms in rooms 7,
 10, and 12 inside the Main Lodge

Today, the Sky Lodge team is working with Unity Environmental University at Pineland (Unity's in-person learning program) to host interactive field research programs and courses. These courses will utilize the Sky Lodge campus as well as the diverse ecological landscape that surrounds it.

New signage that reflects our name change from Unity College to Unity Environmental University will be installed for both the Elaine and John Couri Welcome Center and the Main Lodge property in August of 2025.

Now that the renovations are complete, we plan to once again host Unity Environmental University students at Sky Lodge, using the campus as a platform for interactive field research projects.
